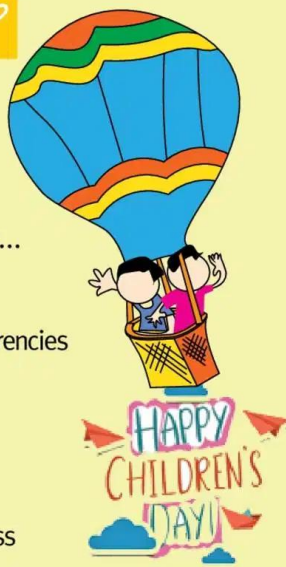

### NASA's Lucy To Visit Eight Asteroids

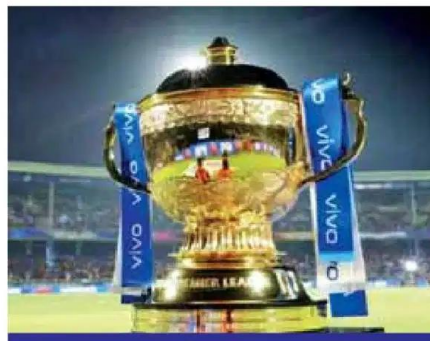
## Facebook Company Renamed To 'META'

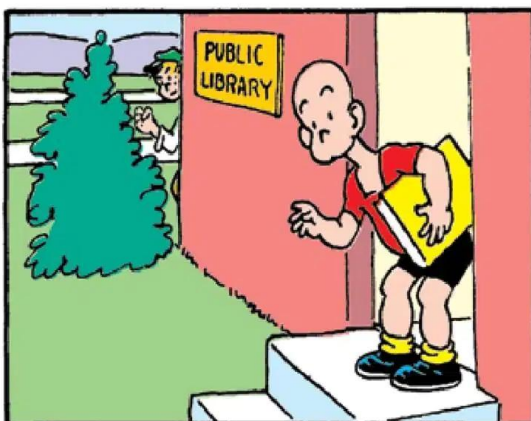
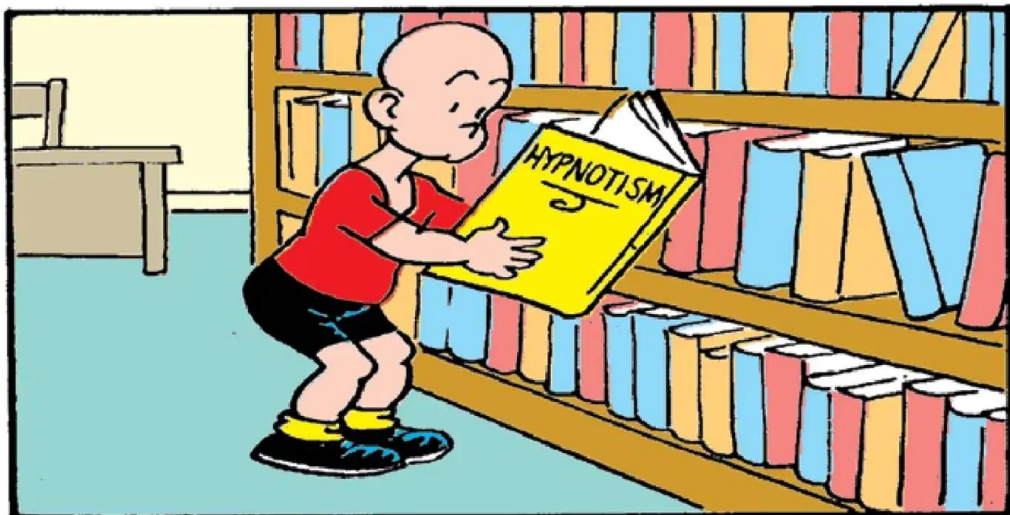
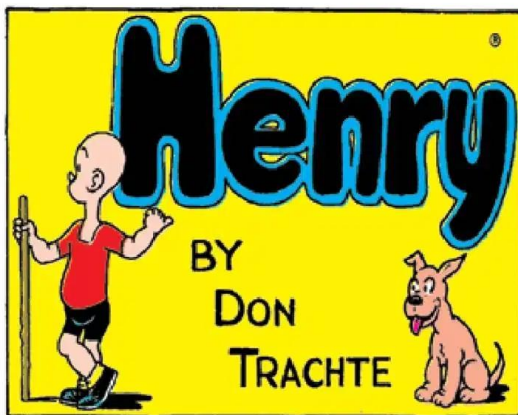

## Microscope Owned By Charles Darwin Goes Up For Auction

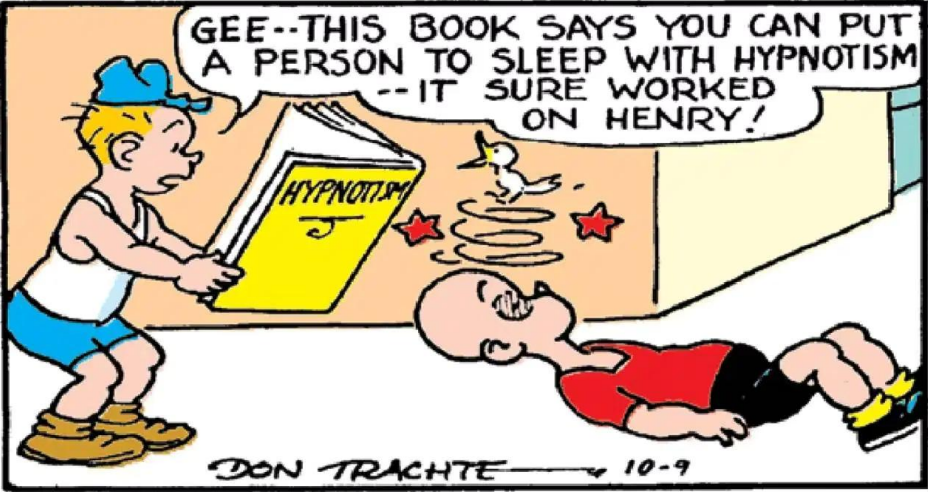
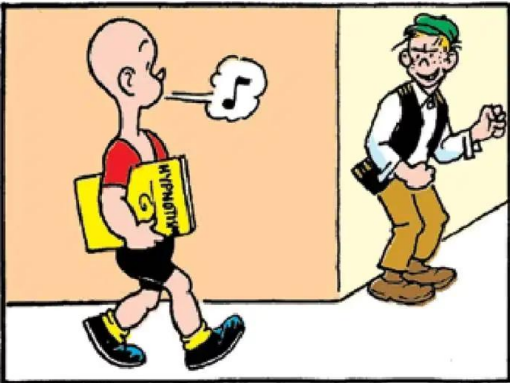
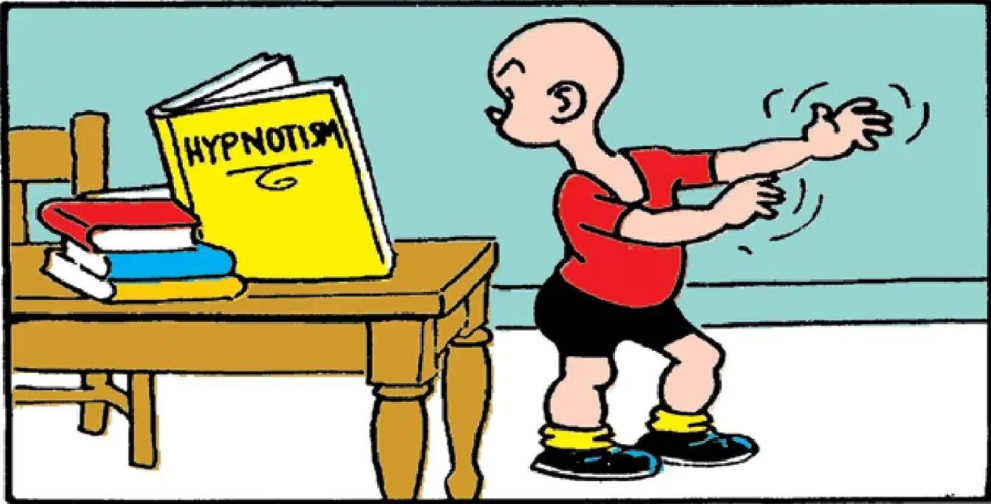

**Rameshbabu P.,  
Chess Master Rameshbabu**

Praggnanandhaa became the youngest international master in history at the age of 10. He is now 15 years old. Rameshbabuhaswonmany titles internationally too. In October 2019, he created history by winning the World Youth Championships in the Under 18 category with a score of 9/11. And, in December 2019, he became the second-youngest person to be rated 2600 Elo (a system to calculate skill level in players).



**Lydian Nadhaswaram,  
Pianist**

This 15 year old is a young Indian pianist from Chennai, who is a student of musician A.R. Rahman's 'KM Music Conservatory'. He has won the CBS talent show, 'The World's Best' in 2019 and won \$1 million as prize money. He stunned the judges on the show by playing 280 beats per minute. Which was later increased to 325 beats per minute. Lydian showcases his skills on his social media channels.

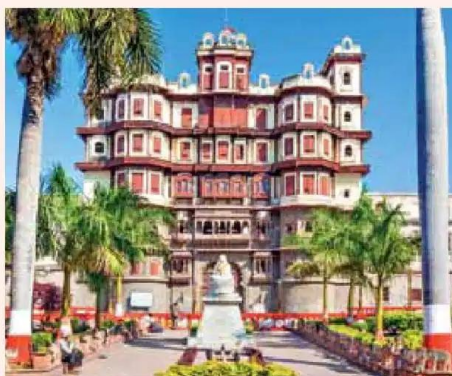




# Indore The City With Many Facts

■ Ujjain & Omkareshwar are the only cities in India which have two greatest holy jyotirling sites. Both are very close to Indore.

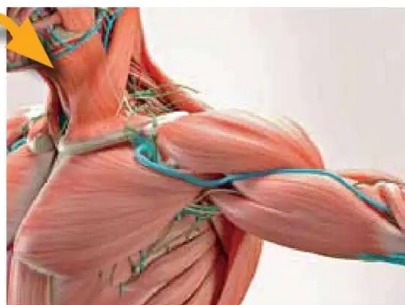

According to the reports, India has the highest numbers of Crypto owners in the world. **Sneha Parashar** introduces you to this new era currency.

## What Are Cryptocurrencies?

Cryptocurrencies are just like money tokens in a monopoly, but the difference is that they are digital. That means you can use them, see them, but you can't touch them, unlike physical currency.



## Crypto Facts

■ The first commercial Bitcoin transaction was for pizza.



- The creator (or creators) of cryptocurrency remains anonymous. Nobody knows who invented it.
- There are more than 1,300 cryptocurrencies.
- Cryptocurrencies don't have a "fixed value" set by the government. Their value is determined by what people are willing to pay for them.

## QR Cards

QR codes are groups of black and white boxes. They are similar to barcodes. Bitcoin uses QR codes that can store a lot of information in a small space, and a camera such as a smartphone can read them.



**Investment**  
Cryptocurrencies, especially Bitcoin, is one of the most lucrative investment options currently. Its value appreciation keeps on changing and can prove to be an excellent avenue for capital expansion.



**Mining:** The process of generating bitcoins is called mining.



**Wallets:** Wallets provide a handy way to keep track of a user's public and private address. It holds all this information in a convenient place, just like a real wallet would.

## Types Of Cryptocurrencies

Just like we have different currencies like Dollar, Yen, Pound, Rupees, etc., there are different kinds of cryptocurrencies like Bitcoin, Ethereum, Ripple, Litecoin, Cardano, and Bitcoin Cash.

## Uses Of Cryptocurrencies

**1 Mode Of Payment**  
Several merchants worldwide like restaurants, flights, jewelers, and apps have come to accept cryptocurrency as a viable payment medium.

## Crypto Vocab

**Blockchain:** The blockchain is a record of all transactions that have taken place in the Bitcoin network. It also keeps track of new bitcoins as they are generated. With these two facts, the blockchain is able to keep track of who has how much money at all times.

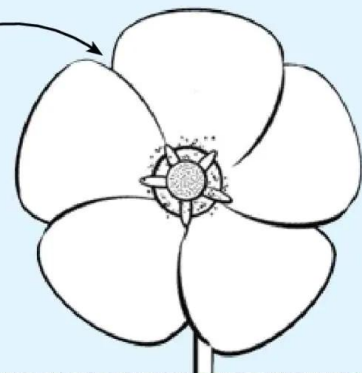

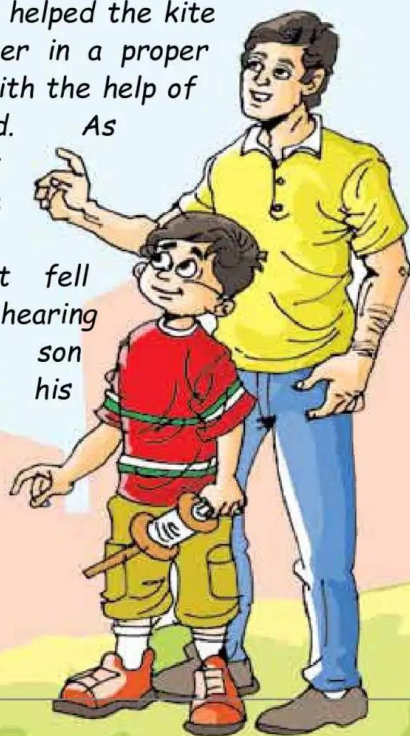
# The Kite Without A Thread

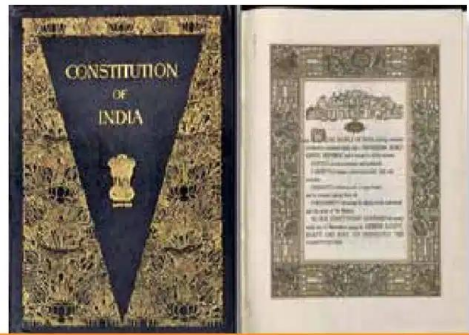


# Bestest Since 1950 !!

*Celebrate the legacy of the 'Indian Constitution' with YB. Here are some engrossing facts about the world's best Constitution.*



■ The Constitution of India has borrowed some of its features from 10 other countries, including the US, Britain, Ireland, Japan, South Africa, Germany, Australia, and Canada. That's why it is called the 'bag of borrowings'.



■ Indian Constitution is the longest constitution in the world with 117,369 words. It consists of 448 articles and is divided into 25 parts.

■ It took 2 years, 11 months and 18 days to come up with the final draft of the Indian Constitution.

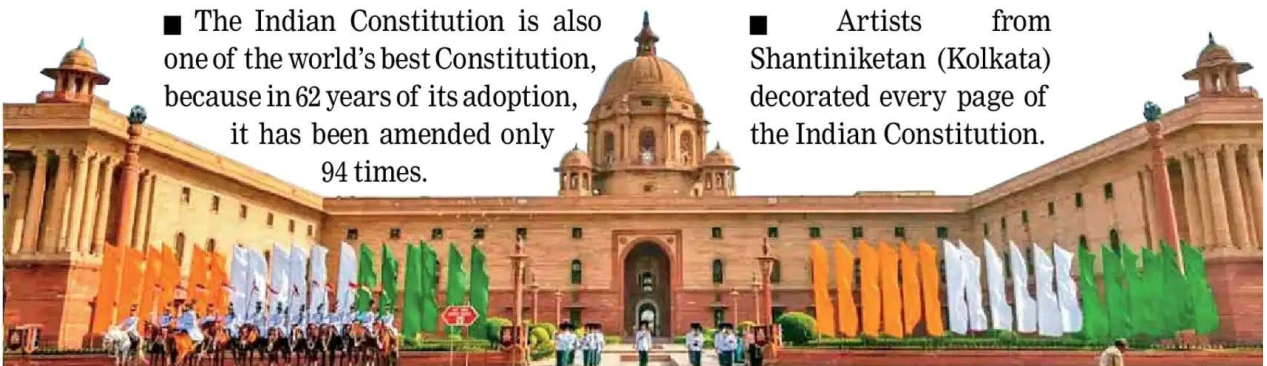
■ Before its completion on 26th November 1949, the Constitution underwent more than 2,000 amendments.

■ The original copies of the Indian Constitution, which were written in Hindi and English, are stored in special helium-filled cases in the Library of the Parliament of India.

■ The Preamble to our Constitution was inspired by the Preamble to the Constitution of the United States of America, which also starts with "We the people".

■ The Indian Constitution is also one of the world's best Constitution, because in 62 years of its adoption, it has been amended only 94 times.

■ Artists from Shantiniketan (Kolkata) decorated every page of the Indian Constitution.







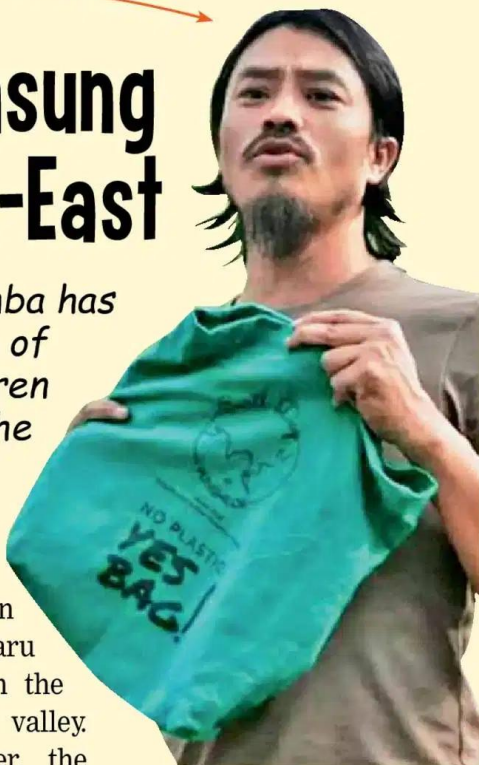
# LOIYA The Unsung Hero Of North-East



## Golden Words

Loiya has a strong point to convey. He says, confining environmental education to textbooks would not help. Children need to be taken to the forests, go to camping, inhale the clean air and experience the purity of the place. Once they start feeling it, then only they will put efforts to protect it.

*Moirangthem Loiya Ngamba has been doing a brilliant job of planting trees in the barren hills of North East for the last 20 years, and the result is a lush forest.*



■ North East India is endowed with rich forest resources. But it is also losing its forest cover. When Loiya came back home after completing his education at the Madras Christian College in 2000, he went back to his native place. And thereafter, the loss of forest worried him.

■ In early 2002, Loiya began growing plants on the Maru Langol hill range nestled in the northern part of the Imphal valley. Now, nearly 20 years later, the 47-year-old has contributed to the transformation of the once-dry 300-acre hill into a forest.



■ Initially planting trees was an adventure for him, he did not think growing a forest would be one of his missions. When he started planting trees, he made a hut for himself and lived there for the next six years observing and studying his surroundings.

## Planting In Monsoon

When Loiya was cultivating the forest, he said, he did not have to water the plants, because he would plant right before the monsoons and the rainwater would naturally take care of the environment. This pattern has been followed by him consistently.

## ...And The Result

● This forest has 30 species of bamboo, 20 species of orchids, fig, jackfruit, tamarind, mango, mulberry, oak, & magnolia.

● The forest has also been home to barking deer, crab-eating mongooses, snakes, cicadas, spiders and birds like bulbul & blue magpie.







# Chocolate Fridge Cake



## Get Together

- Digestive biscuits 450gm
- Butter 150gm
- Dark chocolate 500gm (broken into pieces)
- Sugar syrup 2 TBSP
- Raisins 50gm
- Almonds 50gm (chopped)



## Put Together

- 1- Place the biscuits in a plastic bag and bash them with a rolling pin. Don't break them too finely, though. You need chunks, not dust.
- 2- Melt the butter, chocolate, and syrup in a bowl over a saucepan of hot water. Stir together to make a shiny mixture. Remove from the heat.
- 3- When the bowl is cool to touch, stir in the biscuits, raisins, and almonds. Make sure all the ingredients are mixed really well. Now, line the tin with baking parchment.
- 4- Use a masher to press the mixture into the tin and put in the fridge to harden. Cut into the desired shape and serve!

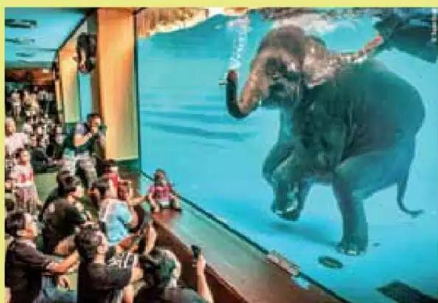
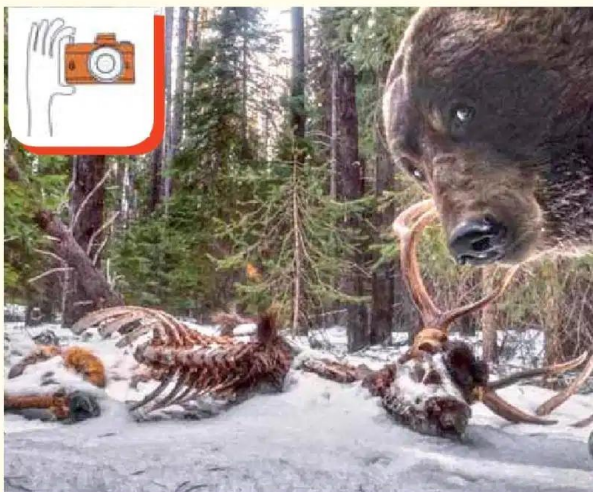

## Grizzly Leftovers

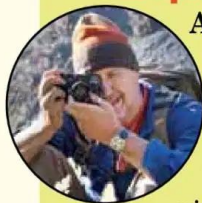


In the 'Animals in their Environment' category, the prize went to **Zack Clothier's** "Grizzly Leftovers".
